- Many followers of Jesus don't allow others to talk with them about their sin. It may be that they don't see the need for it. (Raccoon story)
- God has given us instructions on how to talk with each other about sin, and how to reconcile our relationships..

#### THE CORINTHIAN CONFRONTATION WITH A MAN IN OPEN SIN. 2:5-13: 7:8-10

- Paul's letter led them to deal with the man's sin. The man repented, and it was time to reconcile.
- If they would not reconcile, they would play into Satan's plan to destroy their relationships. (2:11)
- God has given us instructions on how to talk with each other about sin, and how to reconcile our relationships.

### WHAT CAN WE DO?

#### **READ GALATIANS 6:1-3**

- 1. The Shoreline Church needs a plan! Everyone has been wronged, and everyone has wronged another.
- 2. We are qualified to confront when we are godly. We have learned the path of repentance ourselves.
- 3. We approach another believer gently, humbly, and carefully, knowing our own faults.
- 4. Christ Jesus wants us to do this and not think other things are more important than this.

# HOW DO WE DO IT?

#### READ MATTHEW 18:15-17 (HOW OFTEN? VV21-22)

- 1. Go personally, speak directly. Be gentle, humble and careful as you do, and seek to restore.
- 2. To confess is to agree. If you agree, then forgive, restore, and affirm your relationship.
- 3. If there is no agreement, then bring 1-2 others into the conversation. (These too must be godly, gentle, humble and careful). Are you in community?
- 4. If still no agreement, contact the church.
- 5. If a person won't repent of open, known sin, they should be treated like the non-believer they are living like. Discipline is designed to restore.

## **HOW DOES THIS GO WRONG?**

"Everyone who wants to live a godly life in Christ Jesus will suffer persecution."

2 TIMOTHY 3:12

- 1. We are harsh not humble, and we are in the habit of blaming others. We love confronting others to take the light off of ourselves.
  - We need to humble ourselves and repent
- 2. Our walk doesn't match our talk. We refuse to repent, even when confronted.
  - We need to grow out of this pattern. We need to invite others to speak into our life, and change.
- 3. We talk to others without talking personally to the one person. We gossip and slander, causing further damage.
  - We must ask God for the courage to humbly, gently, and carefully speak directly.
- 4. We settle for shallowness rather than open, deep relationships and love is stunted.
  - Refuse to stop short of the life that Jesus has for us together. Commit to love and open hearts.
