Warm Up: What did you enjoy *most* about the Life Traction series? Explain.

- As we learned in this series, momentum is *forward motion fueled by a series of wins*. We must apply consistent effort in one or two areas, trusting God for the “want to” and the “power to” do what pleases Him (Philippians 2:12-13). Break up into groups of two and answer the following questions:
 - What single area of your life are you committed to getting traction and building momentum in this year? Why is this so important to you?
 - Briefly share a progress update and how you plan to succeed in this area.
 - As a larger group, share a couple notable encouragements/stories with everyone.
- When it comes to the area you are *most* seeking to get traction, you can probably identify the ways that the life-thief has come to “steal, kill, and destroy” (John 10:10).
 - What are you proactively doing in God’s power to guard against Satan’s schemes? Be specific.
- Making life-traction (in whatever area) a priority in 2015 is not just about your own personal life or the life of your family. It is also crucial to your service within the body of Christ - the Church. God’s word says, “**All of you together are Christ’s body, and each of you is a part of it.**” - 1 Corinthians 12:27
 - If you were *really* to gain traction and build momentum in the ways you desire this year, how would it impact the Shoreline church family? Discuss.
- On Sunday, George talked about how crucial it is that all of us at The Shoreline be moving forward in a consistent direction. The emphasis of our church family will always be upon God’s Son, God’s Word, and God’s Mission.
 - **God’s Son** - Our goal is to make disciples of Jesus Christ - people learning to listen to and obey God
 - **God’s Word** - We are under the authority of God’s Word, the Bible. It informs *every* aspect of our lives
 - **God’s Mission** - We seek to love God, others, and the world in the power of God’s Spirit

Wrap Up: As you consider each of these, share how you are personally doing in prioritizing each of these. Where do you need God’s grace and the empowerment to live differently?
